

Luke's genealogy (3:23-28) goes back to <u>Adam</u>

Mark's audience included Christians who were being persecuted for their beliefs during the Reign of the Roman emperor Nero. Matthew wrote for a Jewish audience, striving to show them that Jesus came to perfect the law of Moses.
