







Parts of the Mass

Parents and Catechists – The two main parts of the Mass are the Liturgy of the Word, in which we listen to Scripture readings; and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, during which the celebrant changes the gifts of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Review the Mass rituals with your child and help him/her create a prayer intercession and complete the responses. Have your child refer to this booklet during Mass to improve understanding.
